Pros and Cons of Blackboard

- Gives assignments/quizzes to everyone in class and marks
- Keeps track of students' progress
- Once you create a Blackboard course, you can reuse/recycle materials
- Great preparation for students to go to post secondary institutions

- Not intuitive/ learning curve: need to "teach" Blackboard before you can teach English
- Requires learner autonomy
- Need to offer support
- Students might not use Blackboard after ESL

Why Blackboard?

 Blackboard might be the only option (LMS) for creating an online (standalone/supplemental) course

What to Do?

- Make your Blackboard user friendly
- Fewer icons/navigation guide
- Use audio and video (PowerPoint) to meet different learner needs
- Use software available for Blackboard and create interactive activities
- Go with other LMSs

- Have a clear procedure
- Understand your IT department's expectations
- Learn the limitations of Blackboard
- Consider Universal design
- Get copyright permission

When Creating a Blackboard Course

- Conceptualize your course
- Make your units consistent
- Don't put too much text (split pages)
- Consider Universal Design
- Don't use textboxes (rtf)

Ex) Effective Writing for Nursing IEN

- 4 units (modules)
- What you Learn:
- Write nursing reports
- Incorporate information from your readings into your writing
- Write compositions on health-care topics
- Write business correspondence in a healthcare context

Ex) Effective Writing for Nursing IEN Components

- Introduction
- Quiz/ pre-writing activity
- Learning modules which covers important issues
- Grammar and punctuation modules
- Opportunities to compose and write
- Opportunities to edit
