
















OUR ONLINE PLATFORM

DR. DWAYNE DONALD

Dr. Dwayne Donald is a descendent of the amiskwaciwiyiniwak (Beaver Hills people) and the Papaschase Cree and is an associate professor in the Faculty of Education at the University of Alberta. His work focuses on ways in which Indigenous wisdom traditions can expand and enhance our understandings of curriculum and pedagogy.

SCOTT THORNBURY

Scott Thornbury is a teacher and teacher educator, with over 40 years' experience in English language teaching, and an MA from the University of Reading. Until recently, he taught on the MA TESOL program at The New School in New York. His previous experience includes teaching and teacher training in Egypt, UK, Spain (where he lives), and in his native New Zealand. His writing credits include several award-winning books for teachers on language and methodology, as well as authoring a number of papers and book chapters on language and language teaching. Scott is a series editor for the Cambridge Handbooks for Teachers (CUP). He was also the co-founder of the dogme ELT group.

DR. ENA LEE

Ena Lee is an Assistant Professor in Language, Literacy, and English as an Additional Language Education in the Faculty of Education at Simon Fraser University in Vancouver, BC, Canada. Her interdisciplinary work is situated in the intersections of applied linguistics with equity studies. Specifically, she draws on identity theory, critical race theory, and transnational feminist theory to inform anti-oppressive praxes in EAL research and education. Her research has been published in TESOL Quarterly, TESL Canada Journal, International Journal of Multilingualism, and Journal of Multilingual and Multicultural Development, among others.

DR. ROD ELLIS

Rod Ellis is a Distinguished Research Professor in Curtin University (Australia), a longstanding professor at Anaheim University, visiting professor at Shanghai International Studies University and Emeritus Distinguished Professor of the University of Auckland. He is also a fellow of the Royal Society of New Zealand. He has written extensively on second language acquisition and task-based language teaching. His most recent (co-authored) book is Task-based Language Teaching: Theory and Practice (2020) published by Cambridge University Press.
