Preparing for a Winter Adventure in Banff National Park *NEW for 2024*

Exploring Banff's Wildlife Corridors and Crossings



This program introduces students to some of the animals that call Banff National Park home along with some of the challenges they face. Students will also learn about some of the ways technology and careful management are helping wildlife move safely through the park as well as actions they can personally take to support park wildlife.
